Cape Cod Community College Educational Foundation Chairperson John Miller put it succinctly when he wrote that it was "my unwelcome task to inform you that **Natalie DuBois** will be leaving" her role as executive director of the Foundation for personal and family reasons. Miller wrote that the college's distinction of "having the highest student per capita endowment among the Commonwealth's 16 community colleges" is due in no small part to her efforts over the last 16 years. A search committee for her successor will be headed by board member Dave Willard, community relations VP at Cape Cod Five.... And don't forget the Westside. Stephanie of Bumble Productions in Osterville will be making Heart of Haiti Valentine cookies that will be sold for \$5 each. Your contributions will go to the Episcopal Relief Fund to aid Haiti.... She's all that and a bag of chips: Rising jazz sensation Hiromi Uehara has released her first solo album, *Place to Be*, and one of her compositions, **Cape Cod Chips**, salutes her favorite snack. More than half of the 74 men and women in the **Overnights of Hospitality** program last year moved from homelessness to permanent housing, according to coordinator Alan Burt. Of the remainder, 31 percent returned to shelter, 9 percent remained in the Overnights program, and the status of 4 percent could not be determined. Burt is looking for more houses of worship to offer to host overnights for either men or women who would otherwise crowd into the Noah Shelter in Hyannis.
