A "fraught and funny" memoir by **Peter Birkenhead** details his scrapes with an over-the-top dad who had a "summer stock theater in Hyannis, Mass." at which his son acted, according to a *Publishers Weekly* notice. *Gonville: A Memoir* is published by Free Press.... And speaking of summer entertainment in Hyannis, the **Cape Cod Melody Tent** announced its first clutch of shows for the season, ranging from a Beatles tribute June 24 to a WWE World Wrestling Entertainment smackdown Aug. 29. One of Cape Cod's most prominent artistic eminences, **Robert Douglas Hunter**, has been named guest artist for the 25th Anniversary TD Bank Pops by the Sea concert on Aug. 1 in Hyannis. In a press statement, Arts Foundation of Cape Cod President Maggie Van Sciver called Hunter's work "simply breathtaking." The former president of The Guild of Boston Artists, recipient of the first John Singleton Copley Award and many other honors, was celebrated with a namesake gallery at the Cape Cod Museum of Art in 2001. He will create a commemorative painting for Pops by the Sea that will be unveiled May 25 in Osterville and on display at TD Bank in Hyannis from June 1 through July 31, when it will be auctioned at a reception. Limited edition prints will be available during the Boston Pops Esplanade concert Aug. 1....
