Cotuit's **Royston Nash** and Cummaquid's **Rob O'Leary** are among the winners of the third annual Creative Community Awards presented by the Arts Foundation of Cape Cod. Maestro Nash, music director laureate of the Cape Cod Symphony Orchestra, won the Lifetime Achievement Honor. "The blessed success we currently enjoy at the CCSO is due to the strong foundation that was built by its beloved leader, Royston Nash," Maestro Jung-Ho Pak declared in a press statement. State Sen. O'Leary, who won the Community Leadership in Support of the Arts award, was described as "one of the most vocal, passionate, and reliable supporters of public funding for the arts and culture in the Legislature" by Anita Walker, executive director of the Massachusetts Cultural Council. Other recipients include Dennis-Yarmouth High School Fine & Performing Arts Department Chair Daniel Springer (Arts Educator of the Year) and the Falmouth Artists Guild (Collaborative Arts Project award). The honors will be presented during the third annual Creative Collaborative Conference at the Cape Codder Resort & Spa in Hyannis March 25 from 6 to 8 p.m. For more information, go to www.artsfoundation.org...
