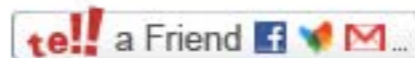

A first place for human interest feature story ("beautifully written... descriptive and eloquent") went to Heather Wysocki, and columnist Paul Gauvin placed third in the serious columnist category ("powerful and affecting").
