## Interactive Show Explores Color Spectrum

The Arts Foundation of Cape Cod will present a free, interactive art exhibit entitled, "ROYGBIV, Exploring the Color Spectrum," at the Cotuit Center for the Arts from January 3 to February 7. This free exhibit is the third annual educational exhibit presented by the Arts Foundation of Cape Cod, and will feature over 50 established Cape Cod artists.

The title of the show, "ROYGBIV," stands for the spectrum of color: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo and violet, and the focus of the show is on the exploration of color in a wide variety of media.

Maggie Van Sciver, president of the arts foundation, said, "Keeping younger patrons in mind, art work will be displayed at a height of 4 feet throughout the exhibit—right at children's eye level."

In addition, a mini-art library will be made available to visitors, and a series of child-friendly events will be scheduled over the course of the month. School groups will be welcomed to the exhibit for the duration of the

show, and will be given docent-led tours and art instruction customized to the age level of the children.

ROYGBIV is presented through the support of College PayWay.
