"If it's not negative wind farm information, you're not going to print it," he began, adding later, "Let's talk about jobs for our children, clean air, less dependence on foreign oil... You guys are amazing. If it's not negative, you're not going to print it." We assume the fellow was riled because last Friday's paper didn't carry a story about the state ordering a comprehensive permit of state, regional and local permissions for the project. It did not because, the Friday before, we ran the following item: "On May 21 shortly after 1 p.m. the state Energy Facilities Siting Board will review its tentative (and favorable) decision..." The *Patriot* attended the prior EFSB session at which that decision was reached and reported the results.... A pleasant way to get to know more of the Cape is to pack a picnic lunch and attend one of the **outdoor concerts** sponsored by the Arts Foundation of Cape Cod and Citizens Bank. This summer, venues include the Dennis Village Green bandstand on Route 6A (we recommend the very danceable Stage Door Canteen on July 13), the Windmill Green in Eastham on Route 6 (check out jazz man Pat Ryan on July 29), the Falmouth green on Main Street (try the big band sounds of The Moonlighters on July 17), Brooks Park in Harwich on Route 39 (for the harmonies of the Parkington Sisters Aug. 3), Mashpee Commons on Route 28 (jazzy Kami Lyle on Aug. 6), and the bandstand on Shawme Pond on Route 130 in Sandwich (the acoustic folk rock of Tripping Lily on July 10).
