**Art from indigenous peoples around the globe** will be on display at the **2009 Cultural Survival Bazaar**, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at Bas Relief Park, 112 Bradford St., Provincetown. The event, on the Cape for the fourth consecutive year, features a wide variety of art items from indigenous craftsmen, many to be at the bazaar to discuss their works. Visitors can expect to find handmade jewelry, weavings, tribal rugs, carvings, masks, instruments and other items. This year's bazaar features music from the Ecuadorian band Yarina, craft demonstrations by Shona artisan Domingo from Zimbabwe, and wood carvings called "alejibres" from an artist from San Martin Tilcajete, Oaxaca. The event also showcases the music and food of these indigenous peoples.
