Like the Cape, (Rabbi David) Freelund explained with a smile, the ancient city, home to the world's three major monotheistic religions, has an historical commission "a lot like Route 6A does.".... Encouraging **violence, to the language**: The headline in a Cape weekly declared "Reward Announced For Pow Wow Stabbing." Ouch!.... **Alan Burt**, indefatigable advocate for the homeless, reports the good news that the Hyannis Salvation Army has found funds to reinstate his hours as coordinator of the Overnights of Hospitality program. He'll be there every evening. "Last year," Burt wrote to supporters, "over half of the men and women we worked with found permanent housing. All were loved and helped, and all because of you." Recommended reading: There's a new book out, **The Making of a Catholic President** (Oxford University Press), by Shaun Casey, who served as senior advisor for religious affairs to the Obama campaign. Casey's style is on the dry side, and he loses himself happily in a forest of details, but he brings intriguing items to light. Kennedy advisor Father John Wright, later a cardinal, felt that JFK "did not understand Protestants at all, and as a result he feared them." Casey says Kennedy conquered that feeling by meeting face to face with Protestant leaders. Also on the scene is another priest, Father John Cronin, "a leading Catholic intellectual" advising Richard Nixon. Protestant fears of a Catholic president doing the Vatican's bidding were shared by some liberal and conservative Protestants, according to Casey, who notes wryly that this is the last time those wings were united. Fans of noted Protestant theologian Reinhold Niebuhr may be surprised to hear that he may have passed along rumors of Kennedy's affairs from JFK advisors John Kenneth Galbraith and Arthur Schlesinger, Jr., though there were denials all around and the talk never entered the mainstream during the campaign.... Can you draw a profile of what Cape Codders like from the following? Six shows are sold out so far at the **Cape Cod Melody Tent**: Joe Cocker, Jeff Dunham, Diana Krall, the Moody Blues, Bonnie Raitt with Taj Mahal, and Boz Scaggs and Michael McDonald. The 21st is also the date for the 29th annual Cape Cod Chowder Festival at Cape Cod Melody Tent. Local venues competing for the WCOD Chowder Bowl include British Beer Company, Harry's Blues Bar & Cajun Restaurant, and Tommy Doyle's. Add Four Seas Ice Cream and live entertainment to your plate. Tickets are \$10 (\$15 on the 21st), \$4 for 10 and under, and free for children under 2. They're available at the box office, by phone (800-745-3000), or on line (<http://www.melodytent.org>).... Speaking of **Four Seas**, this is definitely the weekend to stop by the shop in Centerville. Today (June 19), alumni scoopers will be filling cones and dishes and donating tip money to the Randall Mark Warren Scholarship Fund in honor of Richard "Chief" Warren, the late patriarch of Four Seas. On the 20th, the Hyannis Sound and other bands will play as celebrities including Neal McDonough of *Desperate Housewives* scoop away; 50 percent of the day's proceeds will go to the scholarship fund.... And speaking of Centerville, there's a **nifty house tour** coming up June 24 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The "Now and Then" benefit for Centerville Historical Museum and Centerville Public Library includes peeks inside five houses in and about Main Street. One is the 1835 B&B named for Capt. David Kelley. Another is the 1842 building that served originally as a private boarding school and is now a French country-style private home. For you fans of the contemporary, there's a modern home featured in glossy magazines. For tickets (\$25), drop by the museum or the library, the 1856 Country Store, Claire Murray in Osterville, or Puritan in Hyannis.... Advance word is good on *Patriot* columnist **Alan Petrucelli's** upcoming book, *Morbid Curiosity/The Disturbing Demises of the Famous and Infamous*. Joan Rivers calls it "part *Six Feet Under*, part *Mad* magazine."
