Bourne's scallop festival is a hardy perennial, and now there's an effort in the Upper Cape town to give the mighty quahog its due. The Cape Cod Chamber of Commerce and the Quahog Republic Waterfront Eatery on Mashnee Island will host the first **Cape Cod Quahog Day** June 21 at 2 p.m. It's expected that the "official quahog" will reveal "how many weeks of Cape Cod beach weather lie ahead" (we'll bet the prediction will extend through the shoulder season). Other events include a demonstration of Mashpee Wampanoag traditions and a competition for the titles of Ms. Quahog, Boss Hog, and Mister/Miss Littleneck. There's no admission fee, but it will cost you \$48 to enjoy a clambake on the lawn at 6 p.m.; part of the proceeds will go to the National Marine Life Center in Bourne. That booklet represents a 50 percent discount on admission to the programs of 45 cultural organizations. See the Web site for details.... Census sense: The Better Business Bureau has sent out an alert regarding contacts by **U.S. Census** workers, who are making the rounds to verify addresses. The organization says legitimate Census workers will have a badge, a handheld device, a Census Bureau canvas bag, and a confidentiality notice, and recommends asking to see ID and the badge before answering questions. The Census Bureau is *not* asking for Social Security numbers, credit card or banking information. Finally, BBB advises that Census workers may call or contact you by mail, but will not use e-mail – so don't respond to same.... Here's a clutch of **affordable housing opportunities**.
