Conservatory Celebrates Fall For The Arts

To help celebrate Fall for the Arts, the Cape Cod Conservatory in Falmouth will offer a guitar concert featuring classical students of Joe Scott and a performance by faculty member Will Pfluger at 5 PM on Friday, October 2. The conservatory is at 60 Highfield Drive.

Following the performance, there will be a wine and cheese reception from 6 to 8 PM for the opening of a new art exhibit featuring artists EJ Mills Brennan, Wendy Cavallini, Laura Duggan, Barry Freedland, San Lyman, and Max Redfire Wheeler.

Ms. Brennan is a multimedia artist and musician who paints, sculpts, does fabric appliqué, and creates one-of-a-kind handwoven pieces. Ms. Cavallini is a mixed-media and assemblage/salvage artist who uses glass, wood, paper, metal, and a variety of other materials. Ms. Duggan is a figurative and landscape painter. Her portrait of Chief Justice Sandra Day O'Connor was on display in the National Por-

trait Gallery in Washington, DC.

Mr. Freedland, a sculptor/artist, combines robotic performance elements, humor, and technical expertise and craft. Ms. Lyman, a figurative, landscape, and seascape painter, founded the Falmouth Artist Guild in the mid-1950s. An elected artist member of the Cape Cod Art Association, she is a prolific painter. Mr. Wheeler is an award winning painter, printer, collage artist, and poet.

On Saturday, October 3, CJOY, the Conservatory Jazz Orchestra for Youth, will help kick off JazzFest Falmouth at 12:30 PM. The jazz festival features notable jazz performers from around the country starts at noon and runs until 10 PM at Bigelow Marine Park next to Falmouth Harbor.

Back at the conservatory, Elena Griffin and her students will provide belly dance demonstrations every half hour from 12:30 to 2:30 PM.
